Start working on your prizes! On Saturday afternoon the camp will have Princess games, a climbing wall, archery, rifle range, and arts and crafts available for us. Two model rocket launches per princess have been included in the price of the campout. The dads and princesses will have the opportunity to decorate rockets from kits provided. A Giant Swing is also available at a cost of \$5.00 for 2 swings. On Saturday night we will have a graduation ceremony and an observation deck (weather permitting). We will have the Tribe events and free time on Saturday afternoon and Sunday morning, along with the award ceremonies. This event will include lunch and dinner on Saturday and breakfast on Sunday. Breakfast is also available on Saturday for those Adventure Guides who choose the Friday Night Option.

CLIMBING WALL

An outdoor climbing wall is available, weather permitting. Helmets and harnesses are provided at no cost.

ARCHERY RANGE

Archery shooting is at an outdoor range. Bows and arrows are provided. There is no cost for this event.

FISHING

Fishing is available from canoes only, weather permitting. Bring your own gear and bait. Adults must have an Indiana Fishing License.

CANOEING

Canoes will be available Saturday afternoon, weather permitting. There is no cost for this event.

GIANT SWING

A giant swing for two is available. Once on the swing, you get 2 pushes for \$5.00 per person. The swing will be available Saturday afternoon and Sunday morning.

GAME ROOM

Game room with a pool table, foosball tables and other games available Saturday and Sunday free of charge.

Camp Out Checklist

1. Bedding (sleeping bag or blankets) and pillow.
2. Favorite bedtime toy for Dad or daughter.
3. Towels and toilet articles to wash and brush with.
4. Flashlight with extra batteries.
5. Camera with film.
6. Wear clothes for spring recreation. Dress for the weather and outdoor activity. Bring extra clothes for changing due to weather or accident. Spring campout: boots, gloves, hat, scarf, coat?
Weather can be cold, cool or warm- please dress appropriately.
7. Tribal Assignments (Puddin' Head, games, awards etc).
8. Princess awards (one per princess in attendance plus one extra, minimum 5).
9. Rain Gear.

JUDGED TRIBAL EVENTS

Tribal Event- Princess Prizes/ Craft

The Princess Prize competition will be judged based upon the princesses' selection of the prizes. The first Tribe that has five prizes selected first will receive first place. The first four Tribes to have five prizes selected will receive ribbons for first through fourth place.

Each Tribe is required to bring to the campout a quantity of Princess Awards/Crafts equal to the number of Princesses from their Tribe attending the campout. If a Princess does not want to participate in the craft swap she will just keep the craft she brought to the campout.

Any Tribe that violates the following restrictions regarding Princess Awards/Crafts will receive no points in scoring:

- * NO candy or food of any kind.
- * NO stones or certificate for stones.
- * NO live animals.
- * NO cosmetics.
- * NO weapons.
- * All Awards/Craft must be made in part by the Princesses.
- * Purchased items must be assembled or have value added by the Tribe.

Any violation of the above will result in no score.

Tribal Event- Chief's Hunt

On Sunday at 9:45 AM the Chief's Hunt will begin. All Chiefs and their daughters will meet in the dining hall of the main lodge to receive instructions. The Chiefs and their daughters will hide around the campground. Each Tribe will need to find each Chief and receive from them some type of memento. Once all Chiefs are found by a Tribe, the Tribe is to return to the main lodge and turn in their mementos. This will be a timed event. A Tribe's time will be divided by the number of Dad's in the Tribe participating to determine the fastest time. The Cayuga Tribe will provide all the Chiefs with the mementos to be given out.

Tribal Event- Princess Games

Princess Games 1 and 2, Soccer Dribble and Boot Chunk, will be run by the Camp staff but will be scored by the Sioux. Soccer Dribble will be a timed event with the total time taken to run the course being divided by the number of girls participating. The Boot Chunk will be similarly scored, with the total distance of all tosses totaled and divided by the number of participants. Dads are

encouraged to “chunk”, but their scores will not be considered for the totals. The four tribes who score the highest for each event will receive ribbons.

Tribal Event- Song/Skit

Following dinner on Saturday night, each tribe will perform a song or skit of their choosing. All dads and daughters are required to participate and musical reference (i.e. “boom boxes, iPods) is forbidden. Any tribe that violates either rule is considered to have earned zero points for the event. Judging should be based on originality and participation, and will be performed by the Chief’s daughter from each tribe. No tribe may vote for themselves during this event.

Best Tribe Competition

Best Tribe is based on results of the following:

Princess Prizes, Princess Games 1 and 2, Chief’s Hunt, and Song/Skit.

The scores of these individual competitions will be tabulated and the 4 Tribes with the highest overall point totals will receive the 1st through 4th place. Coin toss will determine which Tribe takes the trophy home in case of a tie for any one place. Every attending member of the 1st place “BEST TRIBE” will receive a “BEST TRIBE” patch. Every attending Princess in the 1st through 4th place “BEST TRIBE” will receive a stone.

In addition, the 4 Tribes with the highest overall point totals in each of the individual competitions will receive 1st through 4th place ribbons. Duplicate ribbons will be awarded in case of ties. Tribal Chiefs and daughters are not allowed to score their own tribe during the song/skit. Points for each event will be awarded as follows: 8 points for 1st place, 7 points for 2nd place, 6 points for 3rd place, 5 points for 4th place, 4 points for 5th place, 3 points for 6th place, 2 points for 7th place and 1 point for 8th place.

Enforcement

Enforcement of the campout rules and procedures is the responsibility of the Nation Chief. Any Tribe or individual with a protest will be given full opportunity to voice and explain it to the Nation Chief. Every effort will be made to maintain their anonymity. The Nation Chief will then discuss the protest with the Tribe against which it was made. After receiving all available information, the Nation Chief will make a ruling. Any decisions made by the Nation Chief are final. The Nation Chief may disqualify a Tribe from an event or game for cheating, unsportsmanlike conduct, or violating the Campout Rules and Procedures.














Puddin' Head

The Menominee Tribe will be assigned the responsibility of bringing **TWO** Puddin' Heads to the campout. It must be soft and padded so as not to cause injury if it hits a little Princess. Puddin' Head may only be handled by the Princesses. Puddin' Head may not be hidden. Tribes may not lock or block their cabin doors to prevent Puddin' Head from being put in their cabin.
